Licensed pathologist Chris Harkness, MS-CCC-SLP, will be offering a presentation on cognition called Aging U.P at the <u>Gwinn Senior center</u>. There will also be a sign up for cognitive assesments for senior citizens.

Seniors are encouraged to attend this 1.5 hour presentation to learn about normal vs abnormal parts of aging in regaurds to our memory and cognition. After the presentation there will be time to sign up for a cognitive assessment. Seniors are encouraged to get a cognitive exam at age 60 or one year after retirement. A variety of skills are tested, including, auditory comprehension, word finding, decision making, and memory. Results are provided at the time of testing, and you will receive a written summary for your records that you can share with your doctor.
